# Pothole Repair Update

In addition to responding to CRM's, the following streets have been pothole-patched of any fillable, significant, potholes:

Rialto, Tippecanoe, Del Rosa, E Street, G Street, H Street, Hallmark, Waterman, Hospitality, Baseline, Kendall, Mountain View, University, Gilbert and Highland, 40th, Northpark, 30th, 9th, Golden, 2nd Street, Cajon Blvd and Third Street.

An additional 160 tons of asphalt material was delivered last week. Public Works is working to expedite street segment repairs that go beyond traditional pothole patching.

While there, meetings were held with Federal Agencies including the Dept. of Treasury, Commerce, Labor, and Veterans Affairs, as well as Senator Padilla, Congressman Aguilar, and staff members of Senator Feinstein and Congressman Obernolte to discuss legislation, Federal programs, and funding opportunities that would benefit San Bernardino. Workshops were attended that focused on housing, broadband, ARPA funds, clean energy, workforce training, and electric vehicles.
